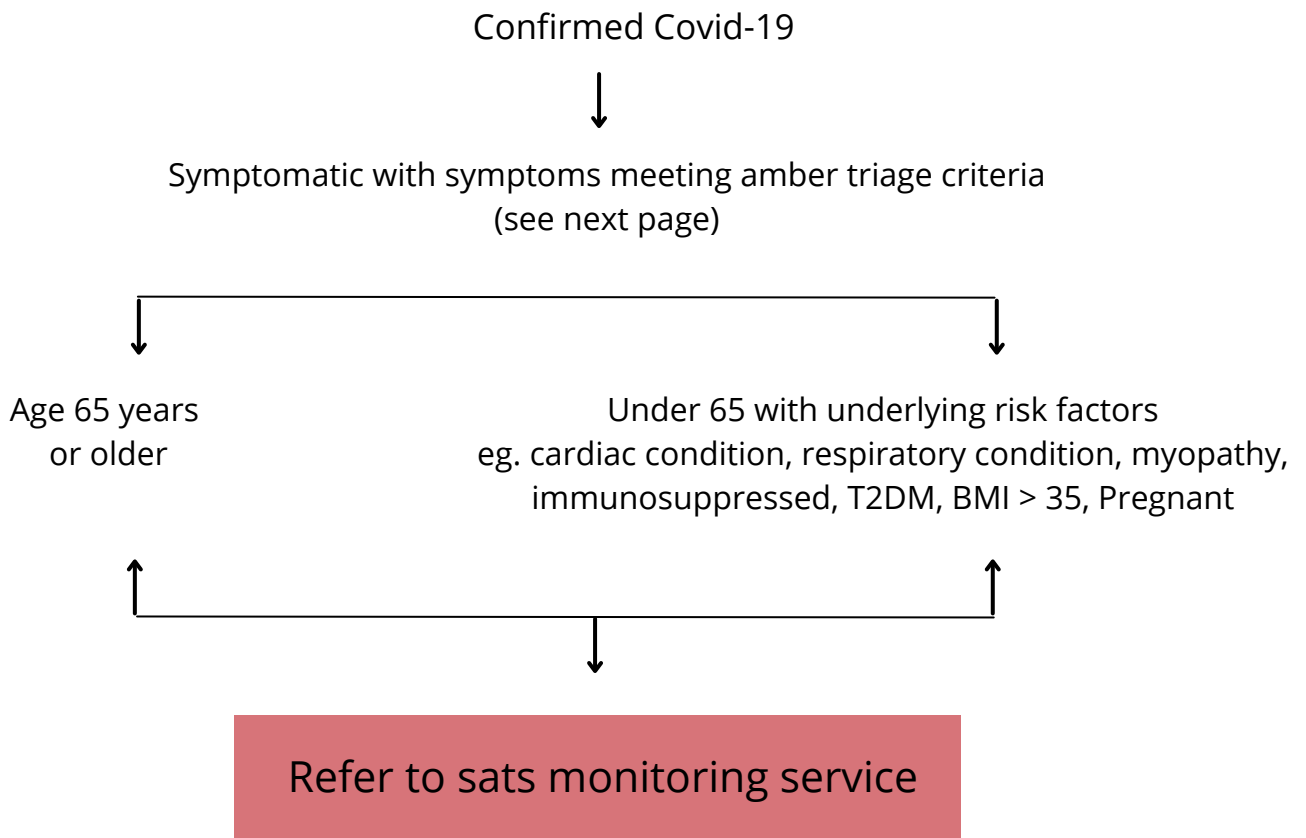


SPCL SATS MONITORING

Surgery



SPCL

Keep on sats monitoring

- Not meeting discharge criteria,
- Meeting discharge criteria , with on-going clinical concern

Discharge from sats monitoring

- Two consecutive negative LFTs
- Asymptomatic for 48 hours with NEWS score back to baseline or 0; ie. sats > 96% at rest, HR <90bpm
- At patients request



SPCL SATS MONITORING

Amber triage criteria

Adults

Feeling breathless or difficulty breathing, especially when standing up/ moving
Severe muscle aches or tiredness
Shakes or shivers
Sense that something is wrong (general weakness, severe tiredness, reduced appetite, reduced urine output, unable to look after yourself)
If you have a pulse oximeter, readings are lower than normal if usually below 95%, or around 93-94% consistently over an hour

Children

Laboured breathing
OR working hard to breathe with recession
Seems dehydrated
Becoming drowsy. excessively sleepy
